# **Journey of Discovery**

In 1844 he started in the Darling Downs, west of Brisbane, and trekked with his team 4,828km to Port Essington, arriving in December 1845.

### Map his journey!

- Show the route he took and the main places /rivers he named, using techniques of his time. That means:
  no computer printouts, but you can trace a map and the journey.
  Hint: You may want to make it look more 'authentic', like an old map from the 1800s.
- 2. Add other interesting facts or findings from this journey, e.g. what did they take with them, who were the members of the team, what happened along the way, what plants and wildlife did he find or discover.
